Please Keep

The **Season of Lent** begins on Ash Wednesday **February 17, 2021** and ends the evening of Holy Thursday **April 1, 2021**.

Abstinence: Everyone 14 and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday **February 17**, and all **Fridays of Lent**.

Fasting: Everyone 18-59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday **February 17**, and on Good Friday **April 2**. Only one full meal and two light meals are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are permitted. To disregard the Law of Fast and Abstinence is seriously sinful.

A few Lenten materials are available on the table beginning Feb. 7.

Operation Rice Bowl: The Catholic Community of Lewis County is participating, The theme is: **(For Lent For Life)**. Rice Bowls are available beginning **Sunday Feb. 7**. You may place your sacrifices in the weekly collection in a white envelope or bring it all on Resurrection Sunday **April 4**.

'The Chrism Mass' whereby the Oils of the Sick, Catechumen and Chrism are blessed will be Tuesday March 30, at **5:30 p.m.** in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Jefferson City, Mo.
